Welcome

Two years ago, I stepped through the door of The Go-Ahead Group's London office and received a warm welcome. Together, we set out on a journey to strengthen and build Go-Ahead as one of the world's best bus and rail operators.

I'm very proud of what we've achieved. But this will be the last time I write this monthly column -I'm leaving Go-Ahead at the end of October, handing over to a new CEO, Miquel Ángel Parras.

When I joined Go-Ahead, the company was going through a challenging period, after running into difficulties with its Southeastern rail franchise. After stabilising the position, we were able to secure a new contract for Govia Thameslink Railway, cementing our future on rail. And this month, we've negotiated a successful exit from our German rail business, through a sale to an ambitious buyer, Austria's OBB.

On the bus front, we've expanded by buying three UK bus companies – Dartline, Southdown and Pulhams - and by entering a new country, Sweden. We've hit a new high in London, running 26% of the capital's buses. And we've made huge progress in introducing zero-emission buses, delivering cleaner air for all.

I'm pleased that our strategy, The Next Billion Journeys, has been adopted across the business. And I've enjoyed working closely with Managing Directors from each of our bus and rail companies.

But for me, the true highlights of this role have been in getting out of the office, visiting depots and meeting team members. It was a real pleasure to be in Crawley this summer, when our first Metrobus hydrogen buses went out on the road, and to be in Newcastle last year as we took delivery of a new fleet of Voltra buses. I never fail to be impressed by the remarkable work of our rail colleagues at GTR's Three Bridges control centre. And I will look back with pride at seeing off the first of our Bee Network yellow buses in Bolton, at 5am one October morning this year.

Go-Ahead is a strong, healthy and inspiring business. Thank you all for your dedication and commitment, and for being a fantastic team. I offer my successor, Miguel, my very best wishes for the future.

The Go-Ahead Group has been named Employer of the Year at the Multicultural Apprenticeship Awards in the Logistics and Transport category.




Cyber Security Awareness Month: The winner is...

Leadership changes at Go-Ahead Group

Miguel Ángel Parras will be The Go-Ahead Group's new Chief Executive from November 1st, replacing Christian Schreyer who is standing down.

Miguel brings extensive experience to Go-Ahead with more than 15-years in business development, transport, infrastructure and environment. In his previous role as the Chief Investment Officer at Globalvia, Miguel led the acquisition of Go-Ahead for the Globalvia consortium team in early 2022.

As Group CEO, Miguel will oversee the next stage of Go-Ahead's growth. The company has ambitions plans to expand in bus and rail in Britain and in selected markets around the world.





Go-Ahead has decided to sell its German rail operations to ÖBB, the Austrian state railway company, in a deal which is expected to be formally completed by the end of the year. This will mark an end to Go-Ahead's four years of operating train services in the southern Germany states of

Baden-Wurttemberg and Bavaria. Go-Ahead believes this is the right strategic decision both for us as a Group and for our colleagues in Germany and is pleased to have found a good long-term buyer in ÖBB with positive plans for investment.

Matt Carney, Bus CEO

Matt Carney has joined us in a new role of Bus CEO, overseeing all of the group's bus companies in the UK and overseas.
