From Armed Forces to a career in transport

Go-Ahead's rail company GTR (Govia Thameslink Railway) has pledged its support to the Forces Community by signing the Armed Forces Covenant.

The agreement will support Armed bringing a variety of transferable skills and qualities to the civilian workplace.

GTR already benefits from a wealth personnel taking up wide-ranging roles in the business - from train network operations and engineering.





Go-Ahead employs hundreds of bus and rail drivers with a background in the Armed Forces.

Alan Tonge, who spent 25 years in the Royal Navy, is one of them - he is a training and recruitment manager at Go-South West's, Plymouth CityBus. Part of his role now involves liaising with the forces in Devon and Cornwall.

"People from the armed services tend to like large, well-managed organisations," says Alan. "A lot of them are used to structure, rotas and regularity. They can slot into driving easily." Alan saw active service in both Gulf wars, in Northern Ireland and in the former Yugoslavia before leaving the forces.

Go-Ahead companies work closely with the Ministry of Defence's Career Transition Partnership which helps resettle leavers from the military.

Dear colleagues,

How many times a day do passengers say 'thank you' to you? Quite a lot, I'm sure, if you work on Go-Ahead's bus and rail networks – because transport workers are among the most 'thanked' people in the country.

Although it might not seem like it when things go wrong, because we've all been on the end of criticism from customers frustrated by delays, a new piece of research by the Confederation for Passenger Transport shows that the public genuinely appreciate what we do.

The average bus driver gets thanked 37 times a day – five times more than the average worker in Britain – and four fifths of passengers say they thank their drivers. And it has an impact – 90% of drivers say getting thanked improves their well-being.

Our purpose, across the UK, Germany, Norway, Ireland, Sweden and Singapore, is to move people around and in doing so, to make progress towards a smarter, and healthier, society. Millions of people rely on our services every day to get them to work, to schools or colleges or simply to travel around their communities and beyond – and it's good to have a reminder that the public recognise the role we play.

It's my first time writing this monthly message under Go-Ahead's new corporate ownership – and you'll see, in this edition, an introductory letter from Kinetic and Globalvia, the new shareholders in The Go-Ahead Group.

As I've said before, Kinetic and Globalvia intend to keep us as a standalone business. We're still Go-Ahead, with the same name above the door and the same head offices in London and Newcastle – we've simply got different shareholders.

The new ownership platform will be useful as we continue to grow our business. And I'm particularly excited that in December, we'll be continuing that expansion by beginning operation of an additional rail network in Germany. This new contract, in the Munich area, comprises 71 stations, and we've just taken delivery of a fleet of brand new Siemens electric trains to run it.

Back in Britain, it's great to see our bus apprenticeship programmes continue to win awards as we bring a new generation of people into the transport industry. And congratulations to GTR, our rail company, on becoming the first transport company to achieve the EY National Equality Standard, reflecting a true commitment to building a diverse, supportive workplace.

Thank you all, as ever, for delivering fantastic transport services.

East Yorkshire does its part to make the region a little greener

East Yorkshire Buses has welcomed eight new vehicles to its fleet as part of its investment to bring state of the art, environmentally friendly buses to the community.

The new buses are replacing some of the older vehicles in the fleet with new Euro VI engines, which produce 95% less nitrogen oxides than their predecessor, Euro V.

New bus routes across Devon

Go South West is launching new services on behalf of Devon County Council on 31 October. The 306, 315, 345 and 377 services will cover routes around Exeter, Okehampton and North West Devon.

Go-Ahead London Route 553

Route 533 became the latest to join Go-Ahead London's Putney Garage, commencing operation in mid-October. The service will use Enviro 200 vehicles, and the route follows the River Thames from Hammersmith to Barnes via Mortlake.



Go-Ahead Singapore's contract extension

Go-Ahead Singapore has secured a three-year extension of its contract to operate buses in Singapore. The extension will begin in September 2023 and runs until 2026.

The Group operates 435 buses on more than 31 routes in the Loyang region of the Island. Congratulations to our colleagues in Singapore!

Annette Geyser from Go South Coast and Greg Thompson from Group Head Office took part in the London Marathon on Sunday 2 October.


Annette, Assistant Communications and Marketing Manager raised £2700 for Cancer Research UK.


She said: "I have had friends and family affected by Cancer, unfortunately, losing their battle against this

The research is commissioned by the CPT as part of their Thank You Driver campaign, which aims to encourage more people to become a bus or coach driver.



Go-Ahead Germany deploys 56 new electric trains

Go-Ahead's rail company in Germany will deploy 56 brand new Siemens electric trains with as many as 1,000 seats on board in Bavaria. The double-decker trains will provide extra capacity for commuters on six busy routes in the Munich area and will begin operating

in December. The new network will serve 71 stations under a 12-year contract – Go-Ahead's fifth rail contract in Germany.

The news means that Thameslink have now provided 300 season-long passes to the club's 16- to 18-year-old apprentices since the partnership began, allowing free travel to their places of study and training. Many could not have afforded to attend without the train company's support.

Get to know...

Alex Chutter Operations Director at Brighton & Hove Buses

What made you go into transport?

I studied Criminology at the University of Plymouth and always intended to go into the police force. I started to look at other opportunities and a Graduate role with Go South Coast came up.

What was your experience as a Graduate?

My Graduate Trainee Scheme led to other opportunities. I did a secondment with Go-Ahead London and then when the Olympics contract came up, I worked on the Go South Coast contract down in Weymouth and Portland Sailing Village.

What has your journey with Go-Ahead been like?

In 2013 I took on the Staff Manager role, this was my first full time role with Go South Coast and I have had subsequent operational roles since. What would your advice be for other **Graduates?**
