From Kyiv to Brighton

The Go-Ahead bus driver from war-torn Ukraine

A driver at Brighton & Hove Buses is settling into his new life after qualifying under a new program helping Ukrainian evacuees to get jobs on the buses.

Volodymyr Syrotiuk, 61, worked in a warehouse near Kyiv before the war and had a licence to drive heavy goods vehicles. But his place of work was destroyed in the war following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, prompting him to join thousands of others in seeking sanctuary in the UK.

Under a partnership with the Government's Department for Work and Pensions, Go-Ahead is encouraging Ukrainians with driving experience to

consider working as bus drivers. The Government has eased paperwork and made it quicker and easier for Ukrainians to obtain a UK licence.

Volodymyr now carries passengers on a variety of bus routes in and around Brighton & Hove.

"I like it here in the UK, he said. "I have family here and I see them quite a lot, I have a daughter who finished university this summer as an architect, it's made settling into the country easier. I'd encourage my friends from Ukraine to come here, and to seriously consider being a bus driver like me. I get to be in a position where I'm responsible for 80 people for every journey and it's satisfying."

We all know that the way customers buy tickets for our bus and rail services has changed over the years. Fewer people use cash. More and more tickets are sold online, via apps or, in the case of rail, using ticket machines.

At Go-Ahead, we want to be sure we're serving customers as well as we possibly can. And that is why a national consultation is underway on changes to ticket offices at railway stations - including the ones we operate at GTR.

We're proposing to move colleagues who work in railway ticket offices out from behind perspex windows, onto station concourses. They will be on hand to help customers find the best value fares, and to deliver assistance to passengers who need it.

Nine out of ten tickets are bought away from ticket offices already. We need to evolve and adapt to meet our customers' expectations - just as railway networks have done on the

continent, and beyond. Nothing is set in stone yet – so please have your say in the consultation.

I'm proud of the work our colleagues at GTR do for customers – it was good, for example, to see the company pioneering a new app recently to help blind and partially sighted people navigate railway stations - and to hear of the creative work underway, including a new nursery rhyme, to encourage people to look after their belongings and to avoid items falling onto the railway tracks.

On the bus front, work continues at a pace on moving towards zero-emission vehicles - we launched our first hydrogen buses in Crawley last month, and work is underway in electrifying our depot in Oxford. In London, things are moving along at an exciting pace - we'll be adding an additional 300 electric buses to our fleet, taking the total to 600 by the end of the year.

A big thank you to everyone who responded to our Pulse colleague survey – our participation rate this year jumped from 37% to 63% of all colleagues, which is fantastic. You can read more on the results on page 5, but it was good to hear that 70% of colleagues enjoy working at Go-Ahead. Rest assured that all of your comments will be taken on board.

Thank you all, as ever, for all the work you do to delivery outstanding passenger journeys for all our customers.

£30 million investment in hydrogen bus fleet and refuelling station

A pioneering fleet of hydrogen fuel cell buses at Brighton & Hove and Metrobus, will carry passengers on routes in the Gatwick Airport, Crawley and Horley area. Once fully delivered, the fleet will comprise 54 vehicles and will be one of the biggest hydrogen bus fleets in Britain. It will be served

by a liquid hydrogen refuelling station – the largest of its kind in Europe.

The zero emission buses are able to cover long ranges and carry heavy loads, making them ideal for local routes around Gatwick that are intensively used - operating 24 hours a day,



Work begins on one of the **UK's largest charging hubs** for electric buses



Work has started on installing 104 electric charging points at Go-Ahead's Oxford Bus Company depot in Cowley. Once complete, the facility will be among the largest zeroemission bus charging hubs in Britain – ready for electric buses to take to the streets later this year. Zenobē, the fleet electrification specialist, is putting in the infrastructure,

with each charging point offering 150kw of DC power enough for a bus to travel 170 miles per day before a top-up.

The charging hub will produce enough electricity to power the equivalent of 16,000 family homes – or to boil 2,700 kettles continuously!

Rail passengers are reminded to keep hold of their belongings with a 2023 take on the nursery rhyme classic – Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes.

GTR (Govia Thameslink Railway) has reimagined the classic children's song to encourage people to look after their belongings to avoid items falling onto railway tracks. The song 'Keep off the Track' was released on Spotify to mark the beginning of Rail Safety Week (26th June – 2nd July).

The song has been re-written to encourage passengers to check their 'Heads [phones], Shoulders [bags], Keys and Phones' when getting on and off trains after Network Rail data revealed that headphones and mobile



phones account for 50% and 43%, respectively, of all small tech dropped on tracks since 2018.


